<u>West Point High School Student Council</u> <u>Campaign and Election Guidelines</u>

- 1. Students who apply for Student Council will be notified no later than 9/4/20 of their eligibility to run for a Student Body Officer or a Class Officer position.
- 2. Campaigning will happen via a pre-recorded speech that will be shown to all students on election day. Students running for elected positions will need to submit a 1 minute, video recorded speech by 9/7/20 to the Student Council Advisor via the submission link sent to them. These speeches will be played in class on Election Day before voting happens.
- 3. Officer Speeches should cover the some of the following topics:
 - In the position you are running for, how can you contribute to building a positive campus culture for all students?
 - In the position you are running for, how can you have a positive impact on West Point school spirit?
 - In the position you are running for, how can you help connect West Point students to the community around them?
 - In the position you are running for, what types of service projects or organizations would you like to see happen?
 - In the position you are running for, how can you help foster connection and ties amongst students during our time of virtual learning?
- 4. Students should refrain from utilizing social media to campaign for elected office.
- 5. Situations of students running for office utilizing social media to negatively campaign against others running, or other students negatively campaigning on behalf of a student running, will be followed up with the Student Council Advisor and a West Point High School administrator.
- 6. Elections will take place during the school day during the week of 9/8.
- 7. Election results will be announced on 9/11/20.
- 8. Failure to abide by the Campaign and Election Guidelines may result in ineligibility for Student Council for the 2020-2021 school year.
